Salzburg International Summer Academy of Fine Arts Résumé 2025 21 July–30 August 2025

Adriana Bustos (drawing), Walter Bruno Brix (stitching), Louisa Elderton (art criticism, writing), Matylda Krzykowski (curating, scenography, installation, performance), Christian Macketanz (painting), Pascal Petignat (photography) and Urbanthinktank_next (architecture)

In 2025, a total of 301 students from 51 different nations enrolled in courses, including 130 scholarship places. There were 301 regular applications for courses, and 591 scholarship applications. Some 3,300 visitors attended the public events.

One of this summer's highlights was the time capsule created in **Christian Kosmas Mayer**'s class. It contains art-works by the students, and in a performative action at the end of the course it was buried for 50 years in Hohensalzburg Fortress.

After a gap of years, a course in comics was directed by German-American artist Elizabeth Pich, whose comic-reading with Stefanie Sargnagel as part of the events programme was a novel and highly entertaining experience for many visitors, due to the live soundtrack.

A further novel highlight was **Walter Bruno Brix**'s class, devoted to stitching and embroidery. The students' very diverse textile projects once again demonstrated the artistic creativity that can be evoked by what are seen as more traditional materials and techniques.

The motto of this year's programme of courses and events was *Diversity of the Future*. A variety of techniques and discursive questions were examined. **Hannah Tilson** and **Otis Blease**, and later **Rossen**

Daskalov taught a wide variety of printing techniques. Irina Nakhova concentrated on nude painting, while Curtis Talwst Santiago and Christian Macketanz devoted their attention to a freer style of painting, focusing on story-telling and strengthening the sense of community. Within the art of drawing, Adriana Bustos shared how to convey one's own thoughts pictorially on paper. Sarker Protick's course was occupied with longer photographic projects, while Pascal Petignat, with guest lecturer Sophie Thun, encouraged students to experiment mainly with analogue techniques and processes. Pablo Martínez-Zárate also experimented with film, video and immersive installations. Matylda Krzykowski demonstrated strategic improvisation, and visitors to the Fortress were frequently greeted by a group dancing or painting in the courtyard. In her performance course, Ofri Cnaani taught how to deal with possible futures, and Julie Hayward's students created miniature worlds to enable better visualisation of largeformat installations. In the class directed by Thalia Hoffman and Manar Zuabi, artistic treatment of topics of displacement and uprooting formed a basis for discussion and creative ideas. In the Untersberg quarry, stone was the protagonist in Neha Choksi's course, serving as both stage and material for the sculptors and performers. British writer and art critic Louisa Elderton dealt with writing about art in the age of AI.

Finaly, the architecture class directed by **Urbanthinktank_next** developed ideas for a more sustainable and diverse future in Salzburg. This course, with 17 students of 12 different nationalities brought a fresh perspective to urban planning issues. In addition, the presence of the participants and the Studio Mobil as an "open classroom" at the Zwergelgartenpavillon increased the visibility of the Summer Academy in the town.

Exhibitions

Again this year, three collaborative exhibitions were held, starting with the students of the architecture class **Urbanthinktank_next**, who presented their *100 Ideas for Salzburg* in the **Stadtgalerie Zwergelgartenpavillon**. The exhibition was completed with students' projects from the course, shown at the final exhibition in the Fortress.

In the **kura-t kunstraum traklhaus**, printing class teachers **Hannah Tilson** and **Otis Blease** showed their first joint presentation, *Bridge* | *Brücke*. It was particularly gratifying that a further co-operation with **Fotohof**, entitled *Shadows in the Sky*, was realised with **Sarker Protick** from Dhaka.

Discursive accompanying programme

Besides the exhibitions, a variety of artist talks, lectures, readings and discussions were held in collaboration with Salzburg institutions. Guests



were Paul Feigelfeld, Lilli Hollein, Senka Ibrišimbegović, Nika Neelova, Stefanie Sargnagel and Valentina Seidel.

Sunset Kino

The three film screenings in collaboration with the Salzburger Kunstverein were once again a great success. Ofri Cnaani and Pablo Martínez-Zárate showed works of their own, the latter even with live music. Sophie Thun and Pascal Petignat curated a programme of short films from the archives of Sixpackfilm, focusing on the subject of the portal, the theme of the course.

Open Studios

The teachers and their students from the art classes invited visitors to tours, film presentations, performances and conversations. Many people took advantage of this opportunity to visit **Hohensalzburg Fortress** or the **Untersberg quarry** and to experience for themselves the unique ambience in these exceptional places.

Music Sets

On three Fridays, the Zwergelgartenpavillon was transformed into a centre of contemporary club culture. Besides the internationally famous DJs Chadee (Munich), Kahlory (Paris), Antonia XM (Vienna) and Lynn Mayya (Linz), two spots were put out for tender, in co-operation with the Salzburg Club Commission, and awarded to manamonD and anders, integrating the local scene.
